These exercises provide a "mixed" practice that brings together the grammar points from a number of different units (especially those relating to the forms of the verb). There are 35 exercises in this section and there is a complete list on page 252. Even at the back of the book there is a guide to the studio to help students to check their answers to all book exercises. An issue without the study guide and the key is available for teachers who would prefer it for their students. Level The book is for elementary students, ie students who are beyond the first phases of a beginner's course. It could also be used by low-intermediate students whose grammar is weaker than the other aspects of their English or who have problems with particular areas of basic grammar. The explanations are aimed at the elementary students who work alone (see the student) or as a material of the additional course. In both cases the book can serve as a one Grammar book. When used as a didactic material, the book can be used for immediate consolidation or for the next review or repair work.
